PRIVACY POLICY

Protecting your private information is our priority. This Statement of Privacy applies to <https://qlinedetroit.com> and QLINE and governs data collection and usage. For the purposes of this Privacy Policy, unless otherwise noted, all references to QLINE include <https://qlinedetroit.com>. The QLINE website is a Transit site. By using the QLINE website, you consent to the data practices described in this statement.

COLLECTION OF YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

QLINE may collect personally identifiable information, such as your name. If you purchase QLINE products and services, we collect billing and credit card information. This information is used to complete the purchase transaction. We may gather additional personal or non-personal information in the future.

Information about your computer hardware and software may be automatically collected by QLINE. This information can include: your IP address, browser type, domain names, access times and referring website addresses. This information is used for the operation of the service, to maintain quality of the service, and to provide general statistics regarding use of the QLINE website.

USE OF YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

QLINE collects and uses your personal information to operate its website(s) and deliver the services you have requested.

QLINE does not sell, rent or lease its customer lists to third parties.

QLINE will disclose your personal information, without notice, only if required to do so by law or in the good faith belief that such action is necessary to: (a) conform to the edicts of the law or comply with legal process served on QLINE or the site; (b) protect and defend the rights or property of QLINE; and, (c) act under exigent circumstances to protect the personal safety of users of QLINE, or the public.

USE OF COOKIES

The QLINE website may use “cookies” to help you personalize your online experience. A cookie is a text file that is placed on your hard disk by a web page server. Cookies cannot be used to run programs or deliver viruses to your computer. Cookies are uniquely assigned to you, and can only be read by a web server in the domain that issued the cookie to you.

One of the primary purposes of cookies is to provide a convenience feature to save you time. The purpose of a cookie is to tell the Web server that you have returned to a specific page. For example, if you personalize QLINE pages, or register with QLINE site or services, a cookie helps QLINE to recall your specific information on subsequent visits. This simplifies the process of recording your personal information, such as billing addresses, shipping addresses, and so on. When you return to the same QLINE website, the information you previously provided can be retrieved, so you can easily use the QLINE features that you customized.

You have the ability to accept or decline cookies. Most Web browsers automatically accept cookies, but you can usually modify your browser setting to decline cookies if you prefer. If you choose to decline cookies, you may not be able to fully experience the interactive features of the QLINE services or websites you visit.
